# A MESSAGE FROM OUR TOP DOGS

Looking back on 2025, it's amazing to see everything we've achieved together. This past year has had its ups and downs for BARRC, but we've come through stronger than ever. One of our proudest moments was in September, when we rescued our 1,000th dog—an incredible milestone in just six years, made possible by our dedicated team and the wonderful community around us.

Of course, it hasn't always been easy. There were some tough times, especially when several dogs needed major surgeries, each costing anywhere from \$1,000 to \$5,000. But thanks to the generosity of our supporters and the help of vet clinics across Bunbury, Perth, the Southwest, and Great Southern regions, every single dog got the care they needed and is now thriving. We're so grateful for the expertise and kindness that made this possible.

The need for rehoming is still high, and our capacity has been stretched to the limit. This year, we focused on saving dogs at risk of euthanasia—sometimes taking in those with only hours left. While the number of animals needing help keeps growing, we've seen a drop in available foster carers. To help, we secured a grant and built some new kennels, which has eased things a bit, but foster homes are still urgently needed. If you've ever thought about fostering, even for a short time, please consider it—it truly changes lives.

Rescue work is never easy, but the passion and support of our volunteers and community keep us going. As we head into the new year, let's keep working together to give every dog the happy, healthy life they deserve.

Thank you for standing by us. We couldn't do any of this without you.

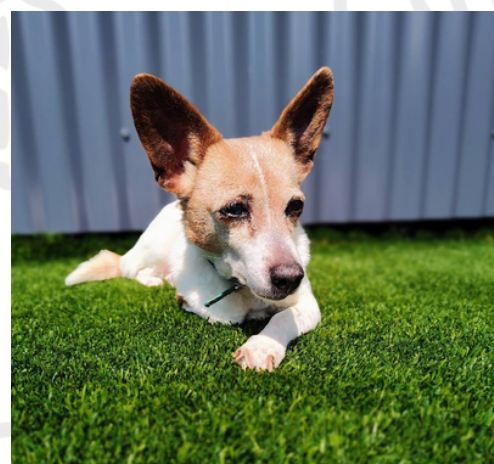

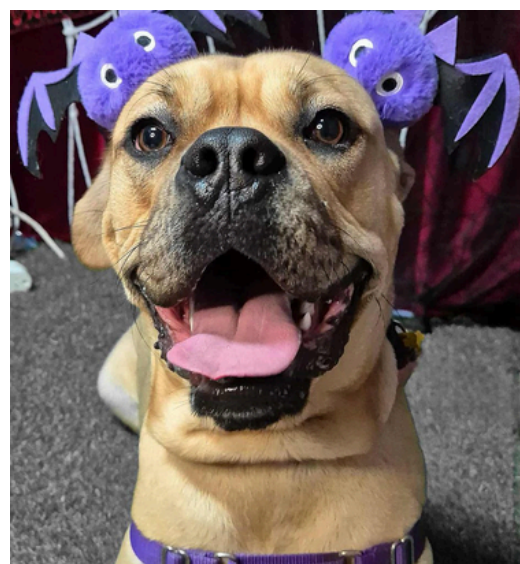

To whoever you are, thank you from the bottom of our hearts! Your generosity is making a huge difference for our furry friends. 🐾

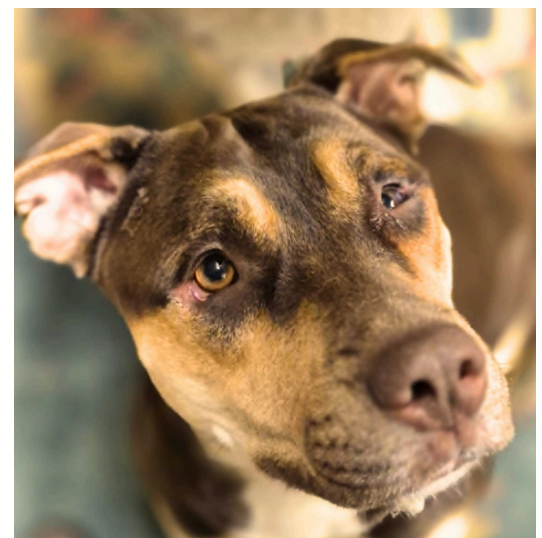
