# A MESSAGE FROM OUR TOP DOGS

To start this July's edition, we want to say a big thank you to all of you who continue to support BARRC—whether you're fostering, volunteering, donating, sharing our posts, or just cheering us on. It means a lot, especially right now.

We are continuing to see a steady increase in the number of animals needing to come into care. At the same time, the number of suitable available foster carers is dropping. It's something many rescues are facing at the moment, and unfortunately, we're not immune. Every week, we're having difficult conversations with desperate doggy parents, who have no option but to surrender their dog. It is heart-breaking telling them we have no room.

To help ease some of the pressure, we have secured a grant to build new kennels. Work in the background is already underway. Kennels have been ordered and the juggle to get all the tradespeople in and lined up has started. We're aiming to have them completed by August, but with the trade shortage we may need an extension, fingers crossed. We will keep you updated on the progress in the next few months. While this won't replace the need for foster homes, it will give us a little more breathing room during peak periods and allow us to take in more dogs when foster carers aren't available.

That said, we still urgently need more foster carers. If you have ever thought about fostering, now is a great time to get involved. Even short-term care can make a huge difference.

We are also desperate for volunteers to help with admin and market stall volunteers. We need support with things like answering emails, managing Foster Carers, posting on social media, and helping us reach more people in the community. If you have a few hours a week and some admin or creative skills, we would love to hear from you.

Rescue work is tough, and it's easy to feel overwhelmed—but having the right people around makes all the difference. We are incredibly grateful to those who have stuck with us through the ups and downs, and we're always keen to welcome new faces to the team.

# BEHIND THE SCENES: STERILISATION PROGRAM MAKING AN IMPACT

At BARRC, we're not just about rehoming, we're also working hard behind the scenes to stop the cycle of unwanted litters before it begins. In addition to offering free sterilisation for the parent dogs of surrendered puppies, we also run a low profile but powerful Sterilisation Program that supports dog owners doing it tough.

Why are we so quiet about his program? Because the demand is far greater than the funding we currently have. The program began in 2023 thanks to a kickstart \$5,000 donation from SavourLife, to which we matched a further While we receive discounted rates through partnerships with a small number of supportive veterinary clinics, BARRC pays for every procedure. In some regional areas, a single sterilisation can cost us well over \$600, depending on the dog's size, condition and the vet availability in that area.



This initiative is referral based only, with Rangers and the RSPCA connecting us with dog owners whose pets have a history of unplanned litters or are at high risk.

This program may fly under the radar, but its impact is lasting. We're creating a long term solution that benefits the animals, the community and our already stretched rescue network.

The program currently operates from funds raised through public donations to our Containers for Change Scheme. If you'd like to help us continue this important work, please consider donating via our website or contributing through our Containers for Change account. 
